FLOWER SHOW RULES

- 1. All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor, with the exception of classes in the Floral Arts Section. The exhibitor may acquire flowers for this Section.
- Every exhibit must bear a number, which will be issued at the Show venue on the afternoon or evening prior to the Show, or on the morning of the Show (see back cover). Exhibits must be in position by 9.30 am on the day of the Show. Exhibitors will be responsible for placing exhibits and checking that they are correct.
- It is hoped that exhibitors will allow their exhibits to be sold for the benefit of Show Funds. Please indicate your wishes on the entry form or otherwise advise the Secretary.
- 4. The Committee will take ordinary care of all exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 5. The decision of the Judges will be final.
- 6. In the event of a points draw the trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of 'First' places.
- 7. **ALL CUPS** must be returned to the Secretary by **1**^{*} **July** each year.
- 8. All exhibitors must:

either reside within one and a half miles of Lee Memorial Hall, as the crow flies, or be a member of the Lee Women's Institute wherever they might live, or be immediate family (including grandchildren) to any of the above, or be by invitation of the Chairman of the Committee.

SECTION A - FLORAL ART

- 2. **"A Study In Scarlett";** An arrangement of flowers; not to exceed 20" (508mm) wide. Accessories may be used.
- 3. A circular table arrangement of flowers and foliage with a candle; not to exceed 12" (305mm) wide.
- 4 **"A Matchbox Arrangement";** A miniature bouquet of flowers and foliage; not to exceed 4" (101mm) wide.
- 5 **"Paris 2024";** An arrangement of flowers and foliage; not to exceed 20" (508mm) wide. Accessories may be used.

RECIPE

Tea Bread (Class 8)

Ingredients

6fl oz (175ml)	Strong warm tea
8oz (225g)	Mixed, dried fruit
1 medium	Finely grated zest and juice of 1 unwaxed orange
6oz (150g)	Light soft brown sugar
1 medium	Egg, lightly beaten
8oz (225g)	Self-raising flour
1 pinch	Sea salt
1 tsp. (5 ml)	Ground mixed spice

Steep the fruit in the strong warm tea.

In a large mixing bowl, place the dried fruit, orange zest, orange juice, sugar and tea. Cover and leave overnight.

Next day-

Preheat oven, to 180 °C / 356 °F / Gas Mark 4

Grease and line a loaf tin (approx. 20 x 10cm)

Stir in the egg to fruit mixture.

Sift the flour, salt and mixed spice together over the mixture and stir into a dough.

Spoon into the prepared tin and bake in the oven for 1 hour.

Entry Forms to be submitted by Monday 22nd July.

Entries from visiting children will be accepted on the day of the Show.

A separate Entry Form is required for each Exhibitor. Any number of entries admitted per person per class.

Exhibits may be staged from 2.00 to 4.00 pm and 6.00 to 7.30 pm on Wednesday or 8.00 to 9.30 am on the morning of the Show.

At 9.30 am on the day of the Show the Hall will be cleared of all persons not officially

engaged by the committee.

Exhibits remaining after 5.00 pm will be deemed for sale but exhibitors are asked not to remove exhibits until after the presentations.

POINTS

will be awarded as follows: 'First' = 3 points; 'Second' = 2 points; 'Third' = 1 point 'Special', (one per Section); = 2 extra points

The winner in each section will be awarded a gift token in addition to the trophy. Monetary awards will be made for a **'First, Second or Third'** in Children's Classes only.
